From The Pastor's Desk

Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving. - Colossians 3:23-24

Now that Home Groups have started again and we are in the middle of our sermon series and our study on The Celebration of Discipline, I thought this would be a good time to reflect on where this congregation has been and remind ourselves where we are heading: Early on, in my time here, before I was your Pastor, for almost a year, I shared with the Council that I believed the Lord was leading us to study on what Biblical Love is. Each of us were encouraged to not just learn about it but to put it into practice in our daily lives. Then all of us were offered an opportunity to start reading the same chapters of the Bible together, with our daily Bible Reading. I am pleased to say we continue to offer this for everyone connected to Evangelical Pietist Church. We then moved into digging deeper in the Word of God being encouraged to not just be hearers of the Word of God but to be doers of the Word as well with teaching and study on finding hope and healing from past hurts and pain and truly loving others through difficult times as well as the importance of holding to a Biblical standard in all things, as the scripture above states, "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, . . ." As a congregation, we learned and studied about this for most of 2024 and council was given the opportunity to learn, study, and understand more about how Jesus Christ did ministry through discipleship and the importance of encouraging and equipping smaller groups of people by looking at scripture and reading through "The Master Plan of Evangelism" together. Then came something, that I can only say with confidence, that the Holy Spirit led us to. . . Pia Desideria.


Pia Desideria, written in 1675 by, Philipp Spener, who is known as The Father of Pietism, he proposed 6 specific reforms to revitalize the 17th-century German Lutheran Church. He focused on piety of the individual, Bible study, and the active role of those in the Church. These proposals shifted focus from rigid orthodoxy to living faith, forming the foundation of the Pietist movement. After reading this resource and going through it together, we believe with the guidance of the Holy Spirit, Council and I saw the wisdom, to work on putting these reforms into action here, today at Evangelical Pietist Church of Chatfield.

(You can find the proposals further in this newsletter. I hope and pray that you are seeing these are slowly being put into action. #1 - We've begun a well thought out and directed Home Group Ministry plan. #2 - We continue to move toward equipping and encouraging the laity for more ministry opportunities. #3 - Healing Restored and The Celebration of Discipline Series both have been an encouragement to put practical Christianity into practice. I am also offering a 6-part video series on-line for all to see and share regarding Pietism and what it is and what it is not. You can find this series on the Evangelical Pietist Church Facebook Page. This is not only for those inside of the Church but something you can use as a tool to have conversations with others about who we are in Christ and who we are not. What is Pietism or What is a Pietist?

Simply put, a Pietist is someone that desires to not only know the mind of Almighty God but desires to put the mind of Almighty God into action in their lives to be a witness to others, and by doing so, gives others an opportunity to find not only salvation in Jesus Christ, but an opportunity for others to see what Lordship of Jesus Christ looks like in a person's life in action and deed. Pietism is basically Holy Living or Right Living, Righteousness. For those that might be asking the question, "Are Pietists Christians?" The answer is a resounding, "Yes." A bible verse that exemplifies Pietism well is James 4:17, ". . . to him who knows to do good and does not do it, to him it is sin."

Since we have chosen to embrace our Pietist German roots and there seems to be much confusion both in society and inside the Church about what piety is, Pastor has begun a video series that you can find on the internet for your own education and enjoyment as well as for sharing with friends and family as a tool for education and for clarity. These videos also can be a great resource in inviting people to join us here for Sunday Mornings and even for our Home Group Ministry at Evangelical Pietist Church.

In [Pia Desideria](#) - Heartfelt Desire for a God-pleasing Reform written in 1675 by, Philipp Spener, who is known as The Father of Pietism, proposed six specific reforms to revitalize the 17th-century German Lutheran Church. He focused on piety of the individual, Bible study, and the active role of those in the Church. These proposals shifted focus from rigid orthodoxy to living faith, forming the foundation of the Pietist movement. These are 6 proposals we are embracing and attempting to put into practice here at Evangelical Pietist Church.

Spener's Six Proposals for Reform:

1. **Extensive Use of the Word of God Among Us :** A more thorough, public, and private study of the Bible, including the use of home group meetings for mutual edification.
2. **Exercise of the Spiritual Priesthood:** Activating the laity in the life of the church, emphasizing that all believers share in priestly responsibilities, not just ordained clergy.
3. **Practical Christianity:** Emphasizing that faith is not just knowledge but a living, active practice (love for God and neighbor) that must be evidenced in daily life.
4. **Charitable Conduct in Disputes:** Limiting theological disputes and, when necessary, engaging with "heretics" or non-believers with love and patience rather than just intellectual combat.
5. **Reforming Ministerial Training:** Ensuring that candidates for the ministry are true Christians, with theological education emphasizing personal spiritual growth in addition to academic learning.
6. **Edifying Preaching:** Directing sermons to the heart, aiming for the strengthening of faith and its practical fruits in the listeners, rather than merely showcasing the preacher's learning.

*** Pastor plans to not only dig into these 6 proposals from Spener, in this video series, but he plans to share about the history of the congregation at Evangelical Pietist Church and our historical roots tied to the 17th-century German Lutheran Church. We hope you will be encouraged and equipped by listening to and sharing this important series with your friends and family.

LifeWise





This is our 7th year of ministry, and what a year it has been. The Senedot Stripes focus is to help young athletes and their families not only learn about Jesus Christ but to help them to be discipled in the Lord and His ways by using the great games of basketball and volleyball to teach and emphasis what God's ways look like.
